No one claimed that any of their possessions was their own, but they shared everything they had. ³³ With great power the apostles continued to testify to the resurrection of the Lord Jesus. And God's grace was so powerfully at work in them all ³⁴ that there were no needy persons among them. For from time to time those who owned land or houses sold them, brought the money from the sales ³⁵ and put it at the apostles' feet, and it was distributed to anyone who had need.

Jesus Appears to His Disciples

¹⁹ On the evening of that first day of the week, when the disciples were together, with the doors locked for fear of the Jewish leaders, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you!" ²⁰ After he said this, he showed them his hands and side. The disciples were overjoyed when they saw the Lord.

²¹ Again Jesus said, "Peace be with you! As the Father has sent me, I am sending you." ²² And with that he breathed on them and said, "Receive the Holy Spirit. ²³ If you forgive anyone's sins, their sins are forgiven; if you do not forgive them, they are not forgiven."

Jesus Appears to Thomas

²⁴ Now Thomas (also known as Didymus), one of the Twelve, was not with the disciples when Jesus came. ²⁵ So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Lord!"

But he said to them, "Unless I see the nail marks in his hands and put my finger where the nails were, and put my hand into his side, I will not believe."

²⁶ A week later his disciples were in the house again, and Thomas was with them. Though the doors were locked, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you!" ²⁷ Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here; see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it into my side. Stop doubting and believe."

The Purpose of John's Gospel

³⁰ Jesus performed many other signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not recorded in this book. ³¹ But these are written that you may believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name.

EASTER 2B, 4-7-24, John 20.19-31 BELIEVING THOMAS, THE SCIENTIST

Johnny Carson was at Harvard to receive an honorary award. After the ceremony, the press had questions. One reporter asked Carson what he would like engraved on his tombstone. He said, "I'll be right back," the very words he said before every commercial break on his late-night show.

According to the record, over and over again, Jesus said those same words to his followers. "Gonna suffer, gonna die, then I'll be right back!" If his followers even heard those words, they seemed to have dismissed them as religious rhetoric or hyperbole. Except for Believing Thomas. Please do not call him doubting Thomas while I am in earshot. I might have a case of apoplexy!

The disciples in today's Gospel are in the third day. They are afraid. They will remain afraid into the second week in spite of an after-the-empty-tomb bodily appearance of Jesus to them, and his breathed blessing of the Holy Spirit into them.

Nobody......absolutely nobody, was counting on a crushed and maimed, cold, dead Jesus, standing up again. There was no disciple welcome wagon at the tomb.

The first witnesses to the empty tomb were met with doubt, fear, skepticism, cynicism, caution, and accusations of grave robbery. When told the <u>real</u> news they said, "Drivel, nonsense, unbelievable, yeah right, women aren't legally recognized witnesses."

After this Resurrection event, everything changes. Huge events with social consequences change the way we understand things and interact with each other. After two millennia of thinking about it and proclaiming it and celebrating it we see in retrospect what a difference the Resurrection made in terms of history, civilization and reality itself. 12 disciples and a support group of women who were the first Apostles, the Apostles to the disciples, started it. By mid-2023, that number has changed from 26 or so followers, to 2.6 billion followers of Jesus Christ! It may be easier for us to rejoice now. Back then in the days, and weeks and decades and years following the Resurrection, fear and uncertainty still held rule. Forward motion in the faith was at first at a fearful standstill.

In the early 2000's Longfellow Elementary had an amazing science emphasis, with science fairs and inter-scholastic competition. Rigorous scientific method was enforced for 3rd to 5th Graders. Do not show up with baking soda and vinegar and be proud of your little model volcano. It proves nothing. An experiment must be conducted that demonstrates a hypothesis. The project had to be approved by one of the science professors at San Jacinto.

In 2005, Josh entered a project proposal, testing for the best combustible fuel used to launch a potato the furthest, out of a homemade PVC potato cannon. It got turned down.

So then, young Joshua Berggren asked, "What if there weren't any grocery stores? In the concrete city, can you grow food without any plantable surfaces?" He had made an observation, asked a question, and was embarked on the first two steps of the scientific method. I casually tossed out, "Sure, grow vegetables in pots." He began to hypothesize. (Step 3. Scientific Method.) He decided you can't produce enough food that way. The problem became maximizing food production in limited space. His corollary hypothesis asked if it was possible to grow more than one plant in a pot. He researched (step 4) and experimented (step 5), by cutting holes in the bottom of pots modified to hang, sticking vining tomato plants upside down out of the bottom of the pot, and filling it with dirt. Then he planted hot peppers in the top of the pot.

12 hanging pots and 24 plants in a 12' by 4' area, the size of a small balcony. He measured them and kept a photo journal and a daily logbook. He kept variables such as food, water, and lighting, equal. He analyzed his data and came to a conclusion (step 6). He presented several hanging baskets to the school Science Fair. They had tomatoes growing out of the bottom and curling up toward the light. Hot peppers were growing out of the top of the hanging pots. They were fruiting in time for the science fairs. He called it his Rotel Farm. Longfellow Elementary gave him the Young Scientist Award, and he won district competition at Sylvan Rodriguez Elementary, in botany.

He was called Scientist Joshua, not Doubting Joshua.

- Step 1. <u>Observation</u>. Jesus body is missing. Be nice if he were alive! But probably not.
- Step 2. <u>Question</u>. Some disciples said they saw him, but it was in private, and they were emotionally upset, and not reliable witnesses. Hysteria was going around those days.

- Step 3. <u>Research</u>. Continue to circulate in the community. Do not stay penned up in a fearful state like the disciples with their claims. See what is going on and what other people are saying. Collect information.
- Step 4. <u>Experiment</u>. If Jesus is out and about, he'll be right back. He can prove to me that it is really him with direct observation of his wounds, both by seeing and by probing them to determine their reality.
- Step 5. <u>Analyze</u>. A week later Jesus appears to disciples plus Thomas. Sight, sound, smell and touch.....yes, it is Jesus without a doubt.

Step 6. Conclusion. "My Lord and my God!"

Thomas carries out the Scientific Method, rigorously applied, based on observable facts, not emotions, *folie a deux*, or mass hysteria, not the fleeting nature of perceived consensus truth at any given time, based on faulty and biased polling, which may not account for the actual reality of the moment. He is Scientist Thomas, not Doubting Thomas.

Thomas gets a bad rap from the adjective tribe. For some reason they don't like facts. They don't appreciate complexity. And they apply their opinions prejudicially. After all, you never heard about Drunken Noah, or Adulterous Murderer David, or Crazy Obsessive/Compulsive Widow looking for a coin, or Back-Stabbing Jacob and his conniving wife, Stealing and Lying Rachel. Then there is Whining Jonah, and Brutal, Violent, Macho, Misogynistic Samson. They didn't get locked in, to those definitions, so why Thomas. I consider him the patron Saint of Civilization. After all, Thomas is the one, who in John 11, urges the disciples to go on to Bethany in spite of the danger. He knew it might mean dying with Jesus. He was listening to Jesus. He got that much about what was going on, and if he had to die, well, fine!

In John 14, Jesus says, "I am going to prepare a place for you and you know where that is." Thomas will not accept that ambiguity. "Time out, Teacher. We do NOT know the way and we do NOT have a clue where you are going. Help us to understand without holy mumbo-jumbo." He is a bottom-line type of guy. Nobody likes them because they expose weaknesses and call for accountability. Just the facts will be fine. Let the facts bring forth the acts.

"But, we have seen the Lord!!!" "Yeah sure, Mr. I-think-I-can-walk-on-water-as-good-as-Jesus-can," Peter.

Thomas is out gathering intelligence. He is gathering data, and communicating with the outside world. He is not like the disciples. He has not shut down. He is not like the kid coming home on break from college.

I ask, "How are things going?" He says, "Fine." "How's the food?" "Good." "And the dormitory?" "Good." "How do you think A and M will do this year in football?" "Fine." "How are your grades?" "Good." "What is your major?" "Communications."

There are the disciples, holed up and out of touch. Not communicating. Are you going to believe them? Are they credible? I am placing my bets on my hero, Believing Thomas. He believed that there was a future. He believed that he could be a part of it. He believed that it was important for his witness to be as accurate as possible. No sloppy emotional assumptions. People will be looking back at his moment, and asking if it is real. He recognized that he would provide a foundation fact, for a group of believers that would eventually become a church of 2.6 billion people. After 2000 years I still need his witness to believe the resurrected life of Jesus, and not worry that it was just a delusional wish dream.

For him, touching, hearing, smelling, and seeing was believing. This makes it possible for me to believe and so to see, touch, hear, smell and taste the Risen Lord.

Jesus chuckles and says, "Have you believed because you have seen me, dear Thomas? Because of you, 'Blessed are those who have not seen and yet believe." Heroic Thomas the Scientist, got us our own Beatitude. Thank you, Believing Thomas. Amen.
