# PENTECOST 26B 11-17-24 Mark 13.1-8,32. "NEW BEGINNINGS"

The Apocalypse is not the end of the world!!! There is a big difference between "The End of the World As We Know It, and an apocalypse. The ideas are confused. An apocalypse is a revelation. It is an unveiling. It is removing the cataracts from your eyes. It is scraping the dark tint off your windows. It is no longer It is a disclosure of knowledge. It is a lifting of the veil. As the Apostle Paul would describe it, it is no longer seeing in a mirror dimly but now face to face. Our passage from Mark is called an apocalypse. It signals a beginning! A beginning of a new world. But people get more excited about scary stuff than they do revelation. By the way, the Greek word for revelation is apocalypse.

Here comes Mark again, with two questions: The disciples are impressed by the city sights. Jesus asks, "Do you see these big buildings? They are temporary. No big deal. The disciples ask, "So then, what is the sign that the new kingdom will start tearing them down?

The signal for the beginning of a revolution is important. It kicks off the first important battle which is a must-win encounter. Just tell us Jesus and we will train our militia and learn the new bugle tunes for "charge". Jesus, tongue-in-cheek, says, "Don't believe in posers, or wars, or earthquakes, or famines." They've always been around, just a beginning. And don't waste time trying to figure out exact timing. Jesus is quoted a couple of times, saying, "Only God knows when the revealing apocalypse will be." (Mark 13:32, and Matthew 24:36.)

One of the nicest things about 'The End of the World As We Know It,' is that even though it has been calculated endlessly in an infinite variety of ways, all of the exact time predictions to date have been 100% wrong. It would seem that every meteorological, geological, international or social crisis triggers a new tsunami of speculation. Many wannabes delight in leading people astray, or gaining fame or capitalizing on dire predictions.

Dr. Martin Rees, is Britain's honorary Astronomer Royal Emeritus. He predicts that there is a 50/50 chance that a world-ending disaster could happen in the near future. Nothing specific on his radar. He is writing in 2003, in a book

entitled, "Our Final Hour." If you collect end of the world scenarios, this is the book for you: Super-volcanos, asteroids, nuclear winter from nuclear terrorism, nano-tech run amok, and oh, yes, engineered viruses. He goes way out on a limb to say that a case of bio-terror, or bio-error will kill a million people by 2020. Covid allegedly has overshot that prediction with 5 million deaths.

But wait a minute here.

The World Health Organization measures diseases on a scale of Disability Adjusted Life Years, (DALYs). One DALY is equal to one lost year of healthy life. Covid is only number 17 on a list that starts with heart disease, cancer, and diarrhea. Just a little perspective here. We are seven and a half times more likely to suffer from heart problems, and about 5 times more likely to suffer from cancer or diarrhea than from Covid. The disciples of doom are devilishly distracted. The War on Drugs which we are losing is three times more likely to disable our healthy lives than Covid. Every year we are losing 100,000 people from overdosing. That's more than the entire American death toll in all ten years of the Vietnam War.

False prophets plague the world with predictions. The problem has to do with fearing the wrong things and focusing on the end instead of the beginning. Mark writes to offer clear leadership, when the world and the church are whispering, "Do you think we are in the last days?"

Mark shouts out, "NO, this is not the end. The mission is still before us, but we are being persecuted and we better wake up!" It is much more motivating, and challenging, and encouraging to know that GOD is near than to waste time wondering if the end is near.

Jesus is clear. Don't ignore obvious dangers, and don't stamp every crazy leader, every tragic war, and every natural disaster as the end of the world. They are not.

Those who study this stuff, tend to agree that apocalyptic worries are a common response to disorienting change. We've got that. Frightening predictions of the future abounded in Persia as its ancient pastoral society gave way to a brutal warfare state. In the Middle Ages, the fall of feudalism and the rise of urban populations made everyone nervously anticipate the worst world ending scenarios.

Even wonderful new innovations with unforeseen circumstances cause nervousness and fear about the future.

Consider the Apocalyptic Potato, a good thing, a wonderful stimulus to civilization imported to the world, and changing the world, thanks to the Peruvians, who cultivated it, 8000 years ago and the subsequent Columbian shipping and commerce from the Americas to the European Continent. Potatoes eased

starvation, raised birth rates, promoted unanticipated health and population growth, enhanced craft specialization, and invention, expanded the marketplace, and fueled an Industrial Revolution. That's a lot of global impact for a lowly spud. I wonder if a microchip or a new virus or a new nano-particle made of graphene oxide for vaccine delivery, would change anything? What do you think? Well, it's not the end of the world. Sounds like the beginning of something instead!

"We are stardust, we are golden...And we've got to get ourselves back to the Garden..." (Crosby, Stills, Nash and Young). Yes, they were special, this enlightened generation. Their new vision would sweep away the rigid old order of their fathers with a 20<sup>th</sup> Century renaissance promising hope and progress for future generations. When their mantle of responsibility was assumed, a new world would be born.

New thought spawned a youth culture embracing vegetarianism, herbal healing, communal living, sexual libertinism, enforced equity, multicultural folklore, and occultism. They cared about the environment and banned DDT, which had mixed results. There are always downrange unintended consequences. The death-rate score is: DDT---zero, Unchecked malarial mosquitos still killed millions. The new generation emphasized organic health foods, promoted Earthdays, institutionalized child care, practiced pre-natal population control, abortion, sterilization and euthanasia. They nationalized health care, and instituted innumerable welfare programs, the federal takeover of education, no school prayer or religious celebrations, and massive deficit spending. Those were the days....the 1930's in Germany.

What Every Ism offers, is fear of The End, the idea of a prodigious and heroic struggle against a demonized enemy, and then world-changing victory, followed by the golden age in the garden of Eden. It is an old and devilish formula: Promote the fear of the end of the world, successfully survive a terrifying non-event, and take the next bus to Erehwon or Utopia. End of the world paranoia—is not confined to wealthy preppers, crazed survivalists, medieval peasants or totalitarian movements. It is a great tool to control populations. The comfortable middle-class who are "woke," would probably be shocked to think of themselves as exhibiting exterminatory drool, but you can't help but notice that the politically correct often have rather violent ideas about what should happen to people who don't agree with them. "Isn't that special?"

The word "apocalypse" means that which is disclosed or revealed. But nowadays when people use it they invariably mean something like a scary end of the world, and that often boils down to one thing: the removal of imperfect human beings. The perfect human beings are the ones who get to decide. If you are not driving when the so-called rapture comes, its curtains for you, anyway. So, here's a strategy; get behind the wheel and wake up. Trust God to lead the way to the party of His Future. Our job is to be alert and awake to the joys and the grace of living in Christ in the present, which is just the beginning.

The end of the world is not a predictable event to come. Weather and geology don't constitute signs of the end. The earliest pagan religions were about controlling the world and its weather through sacrifice. Remember when we all quit paper bags because they were killing too many trees. Now we are all going back because plastic is the newest terror. Now I'm really confused when you get a paper straw in a plastic wrapper. Whatever, somebody is making money on the confusion.

On the other hand, someone like Mother Theresa is a wonderful sign of the revealing apocalypse. It is an event of psychological transformation, an influx of joy in the midst of anything that may happen. Jesus calls us to a grander overarching perspective about the scary dramas of this world.

The last days are the days I let go and let Christ begin.

So simply be alert and ready for living without worrying. Have fun. Learn how to do things from the Stone Age to the Space Age. If you live simply, try a little hi-tech. It's fun. That evil handheld device can be very educational and helpful. If you're a techie, go milk a cow, start a fire, and catch and skin a catfish for supper. Learn what you can, stay loose and rely on God. Then apocalypse---the next step will be revealed. It is discovery! What are you afraid of? Alertly, look forward to God's Party!

Instead of fearing the end, we Christians watch for it. Knowing that it is the fulfillment of all things in Christ Jesus, the goal, the aim of Creation. It is a beautiful beginning. God's Will be done!

The End of the World as I Know It? That happens to me every night when I fall asleep: The old world is complete.

Apocalypse? That happens to me every morning when I wake up. A new world in Christ is revealed. Amen.
